

About Lakeshore Regional Police Service

Is responsible for all policing services on the five First Nations which run along Lesser Slave Lake: Sawridge First Nation on the eastern boundary; Swan River First Nation, Driftpile Cree Nation, and Sucker Creek First Nation on the southern boundary; and Kapawe'no First Nation on the western end.

Works closely with these Nations to prevent and solve crime and police officers collaborate with First Nation members to promote safety and protect their Nations.





Employment with LRPS

Employment standards are set by the Alberta Solicitor General and are the same as all self-administered police service in Alberta.

Constable-Investigator

Priority may be given to persons applying who have recent police experience (within the last 2 years) with a recognized police service. Those applying without recent police experience will have to meet all the recruit requirements as per the Alberta Police Recruit Selection Standards and meet all the training requirements as per the Edmonton Police Service Training Police for recruits. All applicants much meet security clearance requirements.
